

ADMISSION FLOW CHART FOR RE-ENTRY DRUG COURT

Admission into the Re-Entry Drug Court Track begins with the identification of a potential participant as soon as possible. A potential participant can be someone that does not qualify for the Pre or Post-Plea Drug Court program, that has committed drug/alcohol crime(s), has a history of drug/alcohol problems, and/or someone that has completed 559.115RsMo / 217.362RsMo / 217.765RsMo.

There are three ways that an individual can be referred into the program

The prosecutor and defense attorney may make the completion of the program a stipulation of the defendant's probation upon DOC release.

Here the case should be set in Circuit Court and the Circuit Judge must order the defendant to complete the Re-Entry Drug Court Program upon completion of the DOC sentence.

The Sentencing Assessment Report may recommend the referral to or completion of the program upon completion of the DOC sentence.

Here a SAR may have already been ordered, and after reading it the Circuit Judge may order the defendant to complete the the Re-Entry track upon release from DOC.

The Sentencing Judge may order the completion of the program at sentencing or apart of the 90-Day Report.

At any point the Sentencing Judge can order an the completion of the program due to the nature of the case, due to the nature of the defendant's probation violations, and/or due to the recommendation from the 90-Day Report.

Once it has been determined that the defendant has been ordered to complete the program, that information, which may include (the Judge's orders, SAR, 90-Day Report, or Probation Violations), is forwarded to the Drug Court Administrator to evaluate the eligibility of the defendant.

If the defendant ihas been oredred to complete the program and has been deemed eligible for the program by the Drug Court Administrator, the defendant will enter the program following their release from serving their 559.115RsMo / 217.362RsMo / 217.765RsMo sentence.

The defendant will enter the program during the initial hearing date.

Upon completion of the program, the defendant will continue on probation until he/she is granted release from their probation.

If the individual is unsuccessful and is terminated from the program, the defendant's case will be set in Circuit Court for a probation violation hearing.
