Circumstances of alleged offense s: The defendant was sitting in his house when some friends came into the house and wanted to share their cocaine with the defendant. While the friends were getting the cocaine ready to smoke the officers arrived in the home and kicked in the front door. The officers explained that they were serving a search warrant on the defendant's home due to the amount of traffic going in and out of the home. The defendant states that he allowed people to bring cocaine in the home and use it at his home if they shared it with him. The officers searched the home but only found the small amount that the friends had brought in the home. The officers arrested the defendant for possession as another individual for possession of drug paraphernalia. The defendant was taken to the jail and bonded out as soon as he was booked into the jail.

PERSONAL HISTORY:

The defendant is the younger of two boys born to Mom and Dad. He states that his parents divorced when he was three years old and he has lived with his mom until he moved to live on his own at age eighteen. The defendant reports that growing up was good and his mother married step-father when he was almost four. The defendant states that he was a good step-father but was an alcoholic. The defendant states that when his step-father drank he would argue with his mother but was not abusive to her or the boys. He reports that at the age of fifteen he came home and found his step-father dead on the floor. He states that his step-father was a heavy smoker and drinker and died of a heart attack. The defendant states that he had many friends and a good childhood. He reports that he moved out of the home at age eighteen to go to Columbia College. After two years of college he lived on his own and worked. The defendant has never been married and has no children. He states that he is not in a relationship now but had a girlfriend in high school and college but they grew apart. He lived with a woman when he worked at the Lake of the Ozarks but he kicked her out because she was using Meth and stealing money from him.

EDUCATION:

The defendant attended Columbia public schools and graduated from Hickman in 1982. He reports that he liked school and played sports through his senior year. He graduated with a 3.5 GPA. In the fall of 1982 the defendant started Columbia College. He reports that he attended for two years before quitting to work. He states that he has 60 credit hours towards an art degree, and has had thoughts about going back to school.

EMPLOYMENT HISTORY:

The defendant started working at age sixteen at the Coors warehouse. He states that he worked there until age twenty. He worked for Columbia office supply as a warehouse supply and delivery driver. He worked at Columbia Office supply for six years before returning to the Coors warehouse for a few months. In 1991 the defendant moved to the Lake of the Ozarks and worked for his mother and her third husband who owned Selby Dock service. The defendant worked with John for eight years before he bought the business from John. He owned the business from 1999 to 2002 when he sold the business and moved back to Columbia. Since being back in Columbia he has worked for Good Time Bingo supply for a year but they moved to Norman Oklahoma and he did not want to relocate. Since 2003 he has worked as a painter and also refinishes furniture on the side. The defendant reports recently quitting an overnight job at MBS due to not being able to handle the hours.

MENTAL, PHYSICAL HEALTH:

The defendant has no physical or mental health problems.

TREATMENT HISTORY:

The defendant reports attending residential and outpatient services with Phoenix Programs, which began on September 1, 2006. He completed the residential program successfully, however quit the outpatient program a week before he was set to complete due to the MBS job.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE HISTORY:

The defendant first drank and smoked Marijuana around the age of seventeen. He reports that he drank beer and would share a joint with friends on the weekends. He reports that he smoked marijuana four or five times a month until 1991. He state that he stopped because he wanted to be clear headed while running the business. He states that he has since smoked marijuana one to four times a month.

The defendant first used cocaine at age twenty-one. He reports that he did not use it regularly until age twenty-five. He reports that he was using cocaine a gram every Friday for three years. He reports that he moved to the Lake to get away from the Cocaine and stayed away from cocaine for a few months but did start using it once every four months. The defendant reports that he stayed very responsible while he owned the business but when he returned to Columbia. Since being back in Columbia the defendant bought his home and was soon letting people bring drugs to his home as long as they shared with him. Since his arrest the defendant has used at least two times.

He last used cocaine was during July 2007.

He last smoked marijuana was in March of 2006.

He last drank alcohol was during July 2007.

Motivation:

The defendant reports he was foolish to panic and run off due to relapsing. He states that he is at the cross-roads of his life and wants to be clean and not go to prison.
